Extramurally funded TBIs/EDI/Innovation Cell	<p>KISS-DU has set up an innovation council named KISS-DU Innovation Council where, Centre for Indigenous Innovation and Entrepreneurship (<i>Atmanirbharshheel Janjaati Yuva Udyami</i>) providing relevant theoretical and practical skill training and business development guidance from relevant resource persons at the university (including Professors of Practice & Professors Emeriti) and external partners such as the Start-up Odisha, MSME Cuttack, KIIT TBI, EDII Ahmedabad and District Industry Center. The information on various tribal communities collected by students during the mapping process serves as a critical database on tribal resources, indigenous knowledge and entrepreneurial aspirations. KISS-DU has also partnered with renowned platforms for packaging, line development and retail platforms, to assist students in fully realising their dreams from concept to sustainable execution. In this process, the KISS DU strives to empower its tribal youth with the skills and knowledge needed to become self-reliant indigenous entrepreneurs, who can generate sustainable livelihood, revenue and employment both for themselves and their communities, while simultaneously continuing to be the knowledge and skill bearers of indigenous means of craft and livelihood.</p> <p>The <i>Atmanirbharshheel Janjaati Yuva Udyami</i> project is a newly implemented robust entrepreneurship to be capacity development & skill training mechanism for post-graduate students of KISS Deemed to be University. In this programme, students conduct a multi-layered (human, material, cultural) resource mapping process of their villages/localities, to identify the employment needs of their indigenous community in concern to the existing indigenous knowledge, trades and skills, and to identify locally available material, human and cultural resources. Based on this information, students are assisted in brainstorming potential business ideas which are then vetted and incubated based on their feasibility, under the aegis of KISS-DU's Center for Indigenous Innovation and Entrepreneurship. The student entrepreneurs are skilled accordingly during their stay in the University.</p> <p>KISS DU has taken up handicraft technical training under HRD scheme in collaboration with the Ministry of Textiles, Government of India. The program aims at building vocational skills in specialized areas for marketable skills enabling gainful engagement in future careers of the student trainees. KISS DU impart cognitive skill to the student through Mother Tongue Based Multilingual Education (MTBMLE) is a well-established strategy to address language gaps at early learning. 1.3 Learning-outcome based curriculum framework (LOCF) :

The University offers 25 Programmes, at the Masters's and 7 programmes at the Doctoral level. The pedagogic approach of KISS-DU is based on two basic principles of academic flexibility and multidisciplinary orientation. The curricula have been designed to achieve three basic objectives. First and foremost, it must help students master employability skills. Second, it is to inculcate orientation for innovation and research among students. Three, it must localize the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations by means of taking up social/community responsibilities. Together, these pedagogical objectives are aimed at creating change-makers in society, which is the ultimate objective of the university for students.

KISS-DU has therefore implemented an Outcome Based Education system for all the Programmes. Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), Programme Educational Outcomes (PEOs), and Course Outcomes (COs) were defined and mapped in harmony with the Vision and Mission of the University. Every course offered at KISS-DU has a set of defined Course Outcomes. There are twelve general Programme Outcomes (POs) or graduate attributes for all Schools. These include Moral and Ethical Values, Disciplinary Knowledge, Critical Thinking, Communication Skills, Analytical Reasoning, Digital Literacy, Team Spirit, Leadership, Orientation to Lifelong Learning and a Commitment to Environment and Sustainability.

Value-Added Courses and activities are offered towards the holistic development of the students. The curriculum is mapped with skills – Employability, Entrepreneurship and Skill Development and cross-cutting issues – Gender, Professional Ethics, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability.

Feedback about the curriculum is collected from faculty members, students, alumni, and employers through a transparent process. The suggestions and recommendations were recorded, analysed and followed up in the form of Action Taken Reports and placed before the Board of Studies and the Academic Council for approval. The exercise was carried out to ensure that the curriculum of every programme responds to the local/national/regional and global development needs.

The University has developed a robust ICT-based knowledge delivery system. All classrooms are Wi-Fi-enabled and furnished with short-throw projectors with smart-pen devices for effective display of texts and visual graphics as teaching contents. Well-furnished conference halls along with Google Meet, ZOOM etc. are regularly used for Meetings, Conferences, Webinars, Online Orientation Programmes, Workshops etc. Open Educational Resources are often used for effective teaching-learning. During the pandemic and post-pandemic lockdown, teaching-learning continued unhampered as teachers reached out to the students in far-flung and remote places from their desks and used digital writing pads for their teaching purposes. The university has developed its own Learning Management System based on MOODLE through which the Schools' faculty offer their course packs. Each Programme encourages the students to take up online courses being offered through NPTEL, Swayam and other MOOC platforms. Faculty Development Programme (FDP) like 'Development of Online Courses for SWAYAM' is held from time to time to make them aware of the latest methods of teaching-learning. E-resources, e-books, and e-journals are made available to faculty and students through the KISS-DU library. The latter is a member of the National Digital Library of India and subscribes to a number of e-databases such as e-Journals through SAGE Publications and South Asia Archive e-Resources, e-Statistical Databases like Indiastat.

The choice-Based Credit System has been adopted in all the programmes of KISS-DU since 2017, allowing the students to take cross and interdisciplinary courses. Each school offers several course options: core courses, discipline-specific electives, MOOCs, open electives and skill enhancement courses. The diversity in the choice for students ensures that the courses appeal to a wider variety of students as they study them at their pace.

6. Details of the Examination Reforms :

The Examination System at KISS Deemed to be University (KISS-DU) is marked by flexibility and transparency and is open to incorporating reforms and modifications from time to time. Utmost attention is paid to incorporating the reforms recommended by the University Grants Commission. Care is taken in particular to ensure that the system is fool-proof and provides easily accessible channels for the students to register their grievances and transparently address them. Some of the recent reforms included in the evaluation system include the Outcome-Based Education framework, MOOCs, internship experience and project work. These are to be used for assessing higher-order abilities and professional skills. Bloom's Taxonomy has been adopted for assessment design.

With greater ICT integration and automation of the overall examination system, several new practices have been introduced. The process of marks tabulation is now automated. It is carried out by the EDULEAD software developed by Sustainability Outreach Universal Leadership Limited (SOUL). Likewise, EDULEAD also carries out the registration of students by filling up examination forms and admit cards (hall tickets).

The system of examination has been almost fully automated. Most of the activities associated with the conduct of examinations and declaration of results are now performed by ICT tools. The question papers are also prepared using EDULEAD.

To ensure meaningful engagement of the students throughout the semester, special emphasis is placed on Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA), including Mid-Semester examinations for every course, Quizzes/Surprise Tests/ Presentations, Assignments, Class Participation, etc.

The university has implemented the digitization of certificates and mark sheets to prevent tampering and to facilitate their easy retrieval. It has enlisted as a member of the National Academic Depository through the cloud-based platform Digi Locker and Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). Currently, the university has been running regular awareness sessions among the students to encourage greater use of the Digi Locker. Earlier, the credit-based evaluation system, as distinct from a marks-based evaluation system, had been introduced to ensure uniformity with assessment systems in operation in globally reputed academic institutions.

The university has been conducting regular Examination Orientation Programmes for students, faculty and non-teaching staff. Timely publication of results and issuing certificates on time are given utmost importance.

7. Details of the Evaluation Reforms (Whether UGC Report on Evaluation Reforms & other parameters adopted across the following)**7.1 Objective, Structure & Procedural Guidelines:** Yes

7.1.1 Specify: The Controller of Examinations (CoE) is the principal in charge of all examination-related activities of the University. The Academic Council of the University duly ratifies the examination regulations framed by the University Examination Committee. A detailed Examination Manual explaining the roles and responsibilities of the Examination Officers is in place and shared with each School for the information of faculty and students. The Office of the Controller of Examinations regulates and monitors the processes related to examination through Examination Coordinators appointed for each of the Schools.

7.2 Question Paper Design: Yes

7.2.1 Specify: The Dean of the concerned School proposes the list of paper setters, moderators, and (chief) examiners. The CoE issues them letters of appointment with the approval of the Vice Chancellor. Then, the Office of the CoE takes necessary action along with the Asst. CoE/Exam Coordinator of the respective School to procure the manuscript of question(s) from the paper setters. The paper setter(s) are required to upload multiple sets of question papers on the University portal. The moderators then finalize question papers and upload the question packets on the University portal for further action at the office of the CoE. All question papers after moderation and necessary setting are confidentially printed and packed under the supervision of the CoE. The following system has been adopted to maintain the quality of the end semester/ supplementary question paper. The process is reviewed and updated over the years. The Course Coordinator recommends the names of four/ five faculty members from the course committee to prepare the end-semester question papers. A school-level committee including the Dean, Associate Dean, Program Head, and Assistant Controller of Examination finalizes the list of end-semester paper setters including two moderators, to be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor for approval. Once the Vice Chancellor formally approves the list, the respective faculty members (paper setters and moderators) are intimated confidentially by the office of the Dean. The paper setter submits (or uploads) the question paper along with an evaluation sheet template to the moderator. The evaluation sheet template comprises a mapping of individual questions of the question paper with the respective Course Outcomes (COs). The moderator reviews the question paper along with the evaluation sheet template and finally submits (upload through the University portal) the question paper from different paper setters) to the Controller of Examination. The review ensures that the question paper covers all sections of the syllabus, emphasizes knowledge testing and problem-solving, and offers clear and complete instructions.

7.3 Credit Transfer: Yes

7.3.1 Specify: The University has put in place an Equivalence Committee at the University level to facilitate the process of credit transfer for a student migrating from an outside University/Institution. It is headed by a professor nominated by the Vice Chancellor while the Chairperson of the Council of Deans and the concerned Dean of the School, CoE and Director, Admissions serve as members. The Equivalence Committee compares the syllabi of both Universities of different subject items to check the extent of similarities and recommends the transfer of credits including credits to be awarded at KISS Deemed to be University for those subject items. For subjects, not covered earlier by a student in his/her previous University/ institution, or where there are gaps, the student is required to clear a fresh examination under the KISS Deemed to be University examination system. The University has the provision of accepting of transfer of credits earned by a student from other Universities /Institutions accepted by the University Equivalence Committee. Such transfer of credits holds good for transfer from foreign Universities/ Institutions with which the University has signed MoU for student exchange programs. The University permits its students to undertake internship courses/ specialized coursework/industrial training in other recognized Indian Universities or Foreign Universities or a reputed industry and earn certain credits for the fulfilment of his/her degree requirements at KISS-DU with prior approval of the Vice Chancellor and Academic Council. The Equivalence Committee evaluates the internship course/course work/training undertaken by the concerned student for such credit transfer.

7.4 Grading Relative / absolute or other forms: Yes

7.4.1 Specify: A seven-point grading system on a 10-point scale is followed for grading in the examinations. 7.5 On-Demand Examination: Yes

7.5.1 Specify: Examinations for Backlogs and improvement of grades are conducted on the demand of the students. Students register for the examinations at the beginning of the semester for the subjects offered in the semester. The students can opt for both the processes of internal assessment and the end semester examination or only for the end semester examination. Course instructors are assigned to the students interested in improving internal assessment in the courses in which they have a Backlog or wish to improve their internal assessment marks.

7.6 Evaluation Procedure: Yes	<p>7.6.1 Specify: The following process is in place for evaluation. Answer scripts are distributed to the assigned examiners within 24 hours of the completion of the examination. The evaluated answer booklets are assigned to the chief examiner for the reevaluation of a few exceptional cases, i.e. all the papers where a student has secured more than 90% of the full marks of the question paper and below 40% and above 20% of the full marks of the question paper, to ensure that the examiner has evaluated the answer books fairly. The students are shown the evaluated answer booklets to make sure they are satisfied, or to formally record their grievances. The grievances related to the award of marks are addressed by the CoE by re-addition of marks. Exam Coordinator/Asst. CoE and the Programme Head of the respective School are instructed to ensure that the evaluation is completed, and the marks uploaded within the prescribed time limit. After successful completion of the Evaluation, the generated marks are then sent to the CoE office for further processing. The internal component of theory marks is uploaded on the University portal by the examiner before the commencement of the end-semester examination or as per the deadline notified by the office of the CoE. The practical (both components) and sessional marks are also uploaded similarly through the University portal by the respective course teacher and marks are stored in the database. In the Ph.D. programme, the students are required to pursue a minimum 16 credit course in the domain area along with compulsory course work on Research Methodology, Computer Applications & Data Analysis, Research & Publication Ethics as recommended by the Research Scrutiny Committee (RSC) of the scholar before the registration process. At the time of submission, the thesis is verified by Turnitin to remove prospects of any kind of plagiarism in the thesis. Publication of two research papers in Scopus/Web of Science/UGC CARE-indexed journals is preferred, before the award of the degree. The RSC recommends, along with the thesis, the names of Six (Indian and international) examiners from which the Vice Chancellor selects two examiners. When the reports of the examiners come in unanimous for acceptance, one of the two examiners is selected by the Vice Chancellor to conduct the Viva-voce examination to recommend for the award of Ph.D.</p>
7.7 Security & Exam Malpractice Prevention: Yes	<p>7.7.1 Specify: All students are instructed to report 15 minutes before the commencement of the examination. Students are advised to ensure that no objectionable material is lying around his/her seat before. Students are asked not to write their names on the answer sheet under any circumstance. They are instructed to enter their enrolment number, subject name, subject code, date of examination, etc. in the appropriate space. Students are advised not to write anything in the space provided and not to leave their seats in any circumstance without the permission of the invigilator. No student is allowed to leave the examination hall during the first 60 minutes after commencement and the last 15 minutes of the examination session. Rough work if any is to be superscribed as "rough work" or to be crossed out before submitting the answer book. In any case, candidates are not allowed to use their question papers for rough work.</p>
7.8 Technology Adoption: Yes	<p>7.8.1 Specify: The software EDULEAD carries out student registration for examination, issuing of hall tickets and result processing. Students register for the regular and back subjects for the Mid/End semester. An approved copy of the Examiner/Chief Examiner/Paper setter/Moderator List is uploaded by the Asst. CoE/Exam Coordinator in the EDULEAD portal and communicated to the concerned faculty through EDULEAD automated messaging system. Internal theory marks and the practical subject is uploaded by the faculty through their EDULEAD account. Examiners submit the score sheet to the Controller of Examinations through EDULEAD. Results are uploaded on the EDULEAD portal within 15 days of the Examination.</p>
7.9 Option for slow & fast learners: Yes	<p>7.9.1 Specify: The University has introduced well-defined mechanisms to address the students' differentiated requirements. There is, to begin with, the tutor-mentor system. The induction programme involves sessions during which the tutor-mentors interact with the students to find their base requirements and coordinate with various Schools of the University to address those requirements. Tutor-Mentors also keep a close watch and monitor the progress of students. Moreover, The University has designated counsellors who interact with students individually as well as collectively, to resolve their personal and academic issues. The regular analysis is carried out of the academic progress of the various students. Various special facilities are provided to slow learners. Tutorial classes for all courses are included in the timetable. Bridge courses are conducted for freshers at the beginning of the academic session. Remedial classes are arranged for academically weak students from time - to time. Doubt clearing classes are held after class hours in the evening. Likewise, fast learners are also encouraged to aim higher and take up more responsibility. They are often made peer educators or given opportunities to assist with research assignments by the faculty. The students are encouraged to lead academic events, research opportunities, internships, etc. The university has put in place a regular training programme for UGC-NET/JRF, Civil Services examinations and other competitive examinations through the Training and Placement Cell. It caters to both slow and fast students in terms of picking up valuable extra academic skills.</p>
7.10 Innovations in assessment design , evaluation and multi -modal options for learners: Yes	<p>7.10.1 Specify: Continuous assessment and various examinations during and at the end of the semester provide for a round-the-clock assessment system. The course coordinator/program head ensures that evidence-based component-wise marks are available for the activities. Individual Course instructors are free to adopt a practice within or beyond the framework suggested. Different learning activities include group-based evaluation (synchronous/collaborative discussions/ group assignments), critical thinking tasks, case studies, problem-solving or numerical tasks/assignments, creative activities including models/modelling, research surveys/studies, research need identification and infographic summary/presentations and class tests/quizzes. The question paper design addresses the course outcomes. The details are given under the section on question paper design. Project expos and exhibitions are organised where reputed academicians and industry representatives are invited to provide their opinion and feedback on the project work presented. The assessment of practical courses is done through continuous assessment of the student's performance in practical sessions and their performance in the end-semester examination.</p>
7.11 Evaluation-Objective Alignment : Programme/Course: Yes	<p>7.11.1 Specify: The curriculum is designed such that the successful completion of different courses leads to the attainment of defined program outcomes and programme-specific outcomes. Every course has a defined set of course outcomes/course objectives. The syllabus and learning activities are framed accordingly to address the course outcomes or objectives. Every course outcome is linked to different programme outcomes which describe the different graduate attributes for a particular programme. The attainment of the programme outcomes is related to the different course outcome attainments for a particular batch of students. Every Programme also has a defined set of Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs) which outlines what the graduates will be able to attain or do within a few years of graduation. A well-established correlation is maintained and ensured between the Course Outcomes, Programme Outcomes and Programme Educational Objectives.</p>

10.1 Online with Details:

KISS Deemed to be University has a robust tracking system. The KISS Alumni Association (KAA) is the registered body which organizes meetings, activities and various other social and volunteering activities on a regular basis. KAA is a closely knit body which participates in the holistic development of the University and contributes to revising the syllabus from time to time. The Association has a well-structured strategy to reach out to other members of the Association. Some of the key strategies include sending out e-mails on various occasions; dedicated district-wise WhatsApp groups have been established to ensure quick dissemination of information and correspondence; the alumni are encouraged to be active on the official social media platforms in order to catch a glimpse of the day to day activities of their alma mater and Virtual Alumni Meets are organized using Zoom Cloud Meetings and Google Meet. Further, in addition to the above-mentioned mechanism, an alumni web portal to launch in the coming academic session.

District Coordinators are selected from time to time to coordinate various district-level activities. This also includes the offline tracking process conducted with the help of District Coordinators; offline Alumni Meeting is organized from time to time. Peer tracking is another important tracking technique used at KISS-DU. Since KISS-DU is a tribal university, alumni are engaged in Institution Community Projects. The phone numbers of the alumni are collected with the help of District Coordinators both at the block level and district level.

The revision of the curriculum is carried out at regular intervals ensuring the attainment of defined program outcomes and program-specific outcomes. New courses are introduced from time to time to keep the students updated with the latest technological developments and research.

All classrooms are ICT enabled with LCD, projectors and internet and all teachers use ICT resources to impart teaching. KISS DU has its own LMS. The MOOC open courses, Swayam's NPTEL courses, UGC-INFLIBNET digital library consortium and NDL are offered to students and faculty.

Imparting Life Skills Education to Students- Jeevan Kaushal

KISS-DU ensures the integration of core life skills in the course curriculum that can help to effectively deal with problems met in professional careers. Through these life skills, the tribal students are empowered with vital traits essential for employment and for leading a successful professional life.

Social and Industry Connect: University Social Responsibility

KISS-DU believes in cultivating dynamic industry-academia partnerships which play a key role in ensuring the development of an innovative ecosystem, creating highly-skilled globally competent professionals. These collaborations not only enhance employability but strengthen the entrepreneurial ecosystem of the University promoting deep-rooted and enduring socio-economic impact. This plays a seminal role in building healthy social and industry connect. It also conducts philanthropic activities like Art of Giving, Kanya Kiran, Massive Plantation Drive etc. The University has adopted nearby villages to develop those as model villages.

Evaluation Reforms

The University has taken significant examination reforms from time to time. Periodic Assessment ensures that students gain knowledge as per stipulated Course Outcomes defined in the syllabus. Questions were designed to make the students understand the intent and purpose of the subject rather than rote learning.
